## Year 3 Class Homework Grid

This grid outlines 10 different activities that your child can complete between now and April half term.

Please remember your child should continue to read their library AR books daily, practise their spellings and practise on Times Table rockstars at least 3 times a week.

The following activities are all based on our current topic. The expectation is that **one** activity will be completed each week, but the activity is up to your child. Once they have completed one of the activities on the grid, they can colour it in. They may also wish to bring it into school to share with their class or upload pictures to Google Classroom.

Create a collage of a prehistoric Bronze Age scene. Plan what will be in your collage scene (e.g. landscape, people, animals) Choose different papers and materials (reuse and recycle!)	Make up a quiz with facts about The Stone Age. Make sure you also have the answers!	Create a Stone Age recipe using only ingredients that were available at that time. Remember they were hunter gatherers and to write your recipe down	Research anything that you find interesting about the Stone Age or Bronze Age. Think about a creative way to share your knowledge with others. E.g. A large poster, a presentation or a game!	Write a list of at least 5 questions that you would like to ask a Stone Age person.
Find out about Stone Age animals and make an alphabetical list.	Draw and label a Stone Age person. Can you add any similarities and differences compared to us?	We know that the first recordings of art were Cave Art. Design a piece of cave art using materials of your choice. i.e. paint, chalk, crayon.	Create a model or an A3 picture of a Bronze Age village or shelter. Try to make sure you find out what these dwellings were really like and include facts	Draw a Venn diagram to sort similarities and differences between life in the Stone Age and life today.
